PAUL ENCOURAGES TIMOTHY TO BE STRENGTHENED BY THE GRACE

1 So then, you, for your part, O son who is mine, keep on being strengthened by means of the Grace – namely, the grace in connection with an anointed One, Jesus.

PAUL COMMANDS TIMOTHY TO ARRANGE

FOR THE FAITHFUL TRANSMISSION OF THE FAITH

2 And, the *things* you heard issuing from me – with many *as* witnesses – these *things* entrust to trustworthy men who shall be competent also to teach others.

PAUL COMPARES THE VOCATION OF A CHRISTIAN

TO THAT OF A SOLDIER

3 So then, you, for your part, suffer ill¹, as an excellent soldier of Jesus the Anointed².

4 No one who is serving in the army is entangled with the occupations of making a living, in order that he might please the one who enlisted him as a soldier.

PAUL COMPARES THE VOCATION OF A CHRISTIAN
TO THAT OF AN OLYMPIC ATHLETE

5 Now, also, if ever anyone might contend *in the games*, he is not crowned *with a wreath* unless he might contend professionally.

PAUL COMPARES THE VOCATION OF A CHRISTIAN
TO THAT OF A HUSBANDMAN

6 It is necessary *that* the husbandman who is working hard *be* first to receive a share of the produce.

⁷Keep on comprehending what *things*³ I am saying. For, to you the Lord might give ⁴ astuteness in connection with all *things*.

PAUL COMMANDS TIMOTHY TO REMEMBER JESUS

- 8 Keep on remembering Jesus -
- > an anointed One,
- One having been lastingly raised from among dead ones,

> One from a descendant of David according to the Excellent Announcement *that is* mine,

9 in connection with Whom I am suffering distress even to the point of wearing bonds as a criminal might wear.

THE REASON WHY

PAUL PATIENTLY ENDURES HIS SUFFERINGS

However, the Word of the God has not been lastingly bound.

10 For this reason I remain *patiently* under all things for the sake of the Elect *Ones*, in order that these also might obtain a salvation – *namely*, the one in connection with an anointed One, Jesus – along with eternal good repute.

PAUL CELEBRATES THE TRUSTWORTHINESS OF JESUS
11 The Word is TRUSTWORTHY! For –

- ➢ if we die together with Him, we shall also live together with Him;
- ▶ 12 if we remain patiently under suffering with Him, we shall also reign together with Him;
- → if we keep on denying⁵ Him, also that One shall deny us;
- ▶ 13 if we keep on distrusting Him, that One keeps on remaining trustworthy.
- ⁶ He is *simply* not able to deny Himself.
- 14 Remind *people* of these things, being one who continues to bear witness before the Lord⁷.

PAUL WARNS TIMOTHY NOT FIGHT ABOUT WORDS

Do not be fighting about words, *which* for⁸ nothing *is* useful, ending in upsetting the ones who are listening.

PAUL ENCOURAGES TIMOTHY TO PRESENT HIMSELF
AS A GOD-PLEASING OFFERING

15 Continue to be earnest to present yourself to the God –

- > as one tested and proven,
- > as a workman having no cause for shame,
- as one who keeps on cutting the Word of the Truth

PAUL COMMANDS TIMOTHY TO STAY FAR AWAY
FROM PROFANE, VAIN CONVERSATIONS

16 Now, keep going around so as to avoid profane, vain conversations; for, to a great extent they advance ungodliness; 17 and the word that is theirs, like gangrene, shall hold food for grazing – among whom are Hymenaeus and Philetus, 18 who have missed the mark in regard to the Truth, saying that the 10 Raising Up of dead ones has already lastingly come about. And, they overturn the Faith of some.

PAUL CITES THE SEAL ON THE FOUNDATION OF GOD

19 Nevertheless, the Foundation of God stands FIRM, having this seal:

"The Lord Has Come to Know the Ones Who Are His" and

"Let All Those Who Are by name speaking of the Name of YaHWeH¹¹ 12

Stand Far Away from Unrighteousness."

PAUL URGES TIMOTHY TO BE A VESSEL FOR HONORABLE USE

20 Now, in a large house there are not only gold and silver vessels. Rather, there are also wooden vessels and earthenware vessels – even the ones, on the one hand, for honorable use and the ones, on the other hand, for dishonorable use.

21 So then, if ever anyone might cleanse himself from these things, he shall be a vessel for honorable use, having lastingly been set apart for divine purposes and 13 serviceable to the Master of the House, having been lastingly prepared for every good work.

PAUL TELLS TIMOTHY

WHAT TO FLEE AND WHAT TO PERSUE

22 Now, keep on fleeing from the desires which are natural to youth.

Now, keep on pursuing -

- > righteousness,
- > faith.
- love.
- peace

along with those who are calling upon the Lord out of a clean heart.

PAUL TEACHES TIMOTHY HOW TO HANDLE STUPID AND UNEDUCATED CONTROVERSIES

- 23 Now, keep on deprecating the stupid and uneducated controversies, having lastingly known that they beget quarrels.
- 24 Now, *it* is not necessary *that* a slave of YaHWeH¹⁴ quarrel rather, *that* he be –
- kind toward all,
- > apt at teaching,
- > enduring evil,
- 25 with an inner condition of gentleness training those who are offering resistance.

Perhaps, the God might lastingly give¹⁵ them a change of mind toward a recognition of truth, 26 and they might return to sobriety of mind from the *death*trap of the Slanderer, having been lastingly taken captive by him toward the will of that one.
